Details:

After nearly a 2 month investigation into a Drug Trafficking Organization (DTO), the Rogue Area Drug Enforcement Team (RADE) has made several arrests and seizures of methamphetamine that was being supplied into Josephine County and specifically the City of Grants Pass. RADE seized over 2.5 pounds of methamphetamine, 11 firearms, and one quarter ounce of cocaine. Detectives also seized several thousand of US currency attributed to the distribution and sales of methamphetamine. Two children were removed from the home where methamphetamine was being kept and sold. This DTO was supplying mid to street level dealers with methamphetamine that was being sold within Josephine County. The above subjects were arrested and lodged in the Josephine County Jail.

RADE would like to thank Grants Pass DPS, Oregon State Police, Josephine County Community Corrections, Drug Enforcement Agency and the Grants Pass office of DHS Child Welfare for their assistance during this investigation.
