Fall 2020 Application



Thank you for considering the Tree Canopy Program! This program helps our community by providing shade, cleaner air, less flooding, reduced energy demands, improved health, wildlife habitat, and so much more! Your new tree will not just make your property a more beautiful place, it will improve the lives of your neighbors and community members.

The City has fifty (50) trees for this season. Trees only cost land/homeowners \$50. This includes the tree and planting, a \$425 value! All you need do is maintain the tree, which includes watering it at least once per week during the first two or three summers of its life. Trees will be planted in October and November. The City Urban Forester will evaluate your tree site before planting.

Applications with payment must be submitted by September 25, 2020. Payment can be in the form of cash, check, or credit card. For cash or credit card, please visit City Hall's Community Development Department (2nd Floor) to make your payment. You may also pay with credit card (small processing fee) over the phone by calling Community Development at 541-450-6060.

On the following page, you will find the list of available species. Due to limited quantity of each species, your first choice may not be available at the time of your application submission. Therefore, please select a second choice.

The Tree Canopy Program is only for front yards and the Public Right-of-Way (see diagram below).

Please note that for Public Right-of-Way trees, there are some restrictions on which species may be planted. For example, some Public Right-of-Ways are under high-voltage powerlines. For those locations, large and medium trees are not permitted. On the other hand, for large Public Right-of-Ways with no overhead high-voltage lines, only large trees are permitted for planting. Each species on the following page contain information on Public Right-of-Way requirements.

Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*) ♥ Staff favorite!

Moderate growing oak with leaves turning yellow, bronze, and red in the fall. Somewhat shade tolerant. Tolerates drought and occasional flooding, as the name suggests. A superb front yard or street tree. Oaks are great for our climate and will provide benefits for generations!

Height: 60 ft. Canopy Width: 50 ft. Average Lifespan: 300+ years

Public Right-of-Way Requirement: 6+ ft wide planter strip (distance between curb and sidewalk) and no overhead high-voltage powerlines



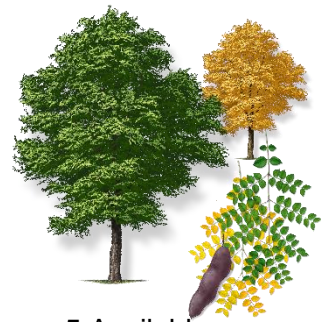

ACCOLADE™ Elm (*Ulmus 'Morton'*)

Moderate to fast growing tree with the classic vase shape of the American Elm. This Asian elm hybrid brings beautiful yellow fall foliage. Drought, pest, and Dutch elm disease resistant. A great shade tree.

Height: 60 ft. Canopy Width: 50 ft. Average Lifespan: 150+ years

Public Right-of-Way Requirement: 10+ ft wide planter strip (distance between curb and sidewalk) and no overhead high-voltage powerlines

Kentucky Coffeetree (*Gymnocladus dioica*)

Large, double-compound leaves give a tropical appearance during summer months. When young, this tree may seem sparse, but just wait a few years and you'll be gifted with a beautiful tree. Tolerates drought and wet soils.

Height: 60 ft. Canopy Width: 40 ft. Average Lifespan: 50 to 150 years

Public Right-of-Way Requirement: 6+ ft wide planter strip (distance between curb and sidewalk) and no overhead high-voltage powerlines

Goldenrain Tree (*Koelreuteria paniculata*)

Long clusters of yellow flowers bloom in mid-summer and form uniquely beautiful lantern-like seed capsules. Leaves change from red-copper in spring to green in summer and yellow-orange in fall. A tolerant tree of many soil conditions but requires proper drainage.

Height: 30 ft. Canopy Width: 30 ft. Average Lifespan: 50 to 150 years

Public Right-of-Way Requirement: 4 - 6 ft wide planter strip (distance between curb and sidewalk) or 4+ ft planter strips with overhead high-voltage powerlines.

Flowering Dogwood (*Cornus florida*)

A "four seasons" tree from flower to fruit to leaves to winter silhouette. Prefers partial shade. Soil should be acidic, well-drained, and consistently moist. Therefore, it is one of the most hospitable planting locations.

Height: 20 ft. Canopy Width: 20 ft. Average Lifespan: 50 to 150 years

Public Right-of-Way Requirement: 4 - 6 ft wide planter strip (distance between curb and sidewalk) or 4+ ft planter strips with overhead high-voltage powerlines.
